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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, an off-road vehicle may not
6	be operated upon the highways of this state.
7	This bill would provide that if an off-road
8	vehicle is publicly owned by a state, county, or
9	municipal law enforcement agency, fire department,
10	volunteer fire department, or rescue squad and meets
11	certain requirements, the vehicle may be designated as
12	an authorized emergency vehicle and may be operated on
13	public streets and highways to perform emergency
14	services.

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Relating to authorized emergency vehicles; to provide for the designation of an off-road vehicle as an authorized emergency vehicle; to provide requirements for such designation; to provide requirements for the use of such vehicle; and to provide for a limitation of liability for such designation and use of such vehicles.

- 27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- Section 1. (a) For purposes of Title 32, Code of

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- 29 Alabama 1975, the chief administrator of any state, county, or
- 30 municipal law enforcement agency, fire department, volunteer
- 31 fire department, fire district, or rescue squad may designate
- 32 any publicly owned off-road vehicle, as defined under Section
- 33 32-8-2, Code of Alabama 1975, as an authorized emergency
- 34 vehicle, if the authorized emergency vehicle is within the
- 35 jurisdiction of the designating agency and the vehicle meets
- 36 all of the following requirements:
- 37 (1) The vehicle is equipped with headlights and brake
- 38 lights.
- 39 (2) The vehicle is equipped with shoulder harness
- 40 seatbelts for each passenger.
- 41 (3) The vehicle is marked with the state, county, or
- 42 municipal agency name.
- 43 (4) The vehicle is equipped with emergency lighting as
- provided in Section 32-5A-115(c), Code of Alabama 1975.
- 45 (5) The back of the vehicle is marked with reflective,
- 46 highly visibile chevrons designed to reflect headlights and
- 47 alert other drivers to its presence.
- 48 (b) An off-road vehicle that is designated as an
- 49 authorized emergency vehicle pursuant to this section may be
- operated within the applicable jurisdiction on the streets and
- 51 highways of the state for official purposes only, including
- 52 emergency call responses and training operations. Such
- vehicles may only be operated by authorized personnel of the
- 54 applicable state or local agency who have the requisite
- training requirements as determined by the head of the agency.
- 56 (c) An off-road vehicle that is designated as an

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- authorized emergency vehicle shall be covered under the applicable agency's insurance policy.
- (d) An off-road vehicle that is designated as an authorized emergency vehicle is exempt from all other licensing, equipment, and other requirements provided by law for the operation of vehicles upon the streets and highways of this state.
- (e) Any individual who, acting in his or her official capacity under this section, designates an off-road vehicle as an authorized emergency vehicle is immune from civil liability in any suit pursuant to Section 14 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
- (f) The state and any political subdivision therein
  shall be immune from civil liability in any suit pursuant to
  Section 14 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, for any
  liability arising from the operation of an off-road vehicle
  designated as an authorized emergency vehicle under this
  section.
- 75 Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1, 76 2025.
