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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, before performing certain
6	work on a public road which involves laying pipelines,
7	pole lines, sewers, railways, or other utilities, a
8	permit must be obtained from the State Department of
9	Transportation. Additionally, the permittee must pay to
10	restore the road to the condition as it was before the
11	work was performed.
12	This bill would further provide for the
13	permitting process by establishing various processing
14	deadlines.

18	TO BE ENTITLED
19	AN ACT
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21	Relating to public highways; to amend Section 23-1-4,
22	Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the issuance of a
23	permit for access to certain state rights-of-way on public
24	highways; to provide certain permit processing deadlines; to
25	authorize associated condemnation actions to be expedited; and
26	to require the Department of Transportation to adopt rules.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. Section 23-1-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is



29	amended to read as follows:
30	"§23-1-4
31	(a) The Legislature of Alabama finds and declares the
32	following:
33	(1) Electric transmission infrastructure is critical to
34	the economic growth and well-being of this state and Alabama
35	has an immediate need to expand and facilitate such investment
36	for the benefit of its residents.
37	(2) Public rights-of-way provide essential corridors
38	and paths for electric transmission infrastructure.
39	(3) Accelerating the issuance of permits for electric
40	transmission infrastructure in public rights-of-way will
41	provide the needed support to industrial growth, job creation,
42	and economic development, particularly in rural and
43	underserved areas.
44	(b) No state-controlled road shall be dug up or used
45	for laying pipelines, pole lines, sewers, railways, or for
46	other similar purposes without the written permit of the State
47	Department of Transportation, and such the work shall be done
48	only in accordance with the regulations prescribed rules
49	adopted by the department, and the.
50	(c) The permitee shall pay the cost of replacing the
51	road in as good condition as it was before <mark>such the permitted</mark>
52	work was done shall be paid by the person, firm, or
53	corporation to whom or in whose behalf such permit was given.
54	Such person, firm, or corporation so desiring such workIn
55	accordance with rules adopted by the department, an applicant
56	for a permit under this section shall furnish the state with a

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57	cash deposit or certified check upon a solvent bank or surety
58	bond in guaranty company qualified to do business in Alabama,
59	in the amount required by the State Department of
60	Transportationdepartment, conditioned that the sum is to be
61	forfeited to the state in the event that <mark>said the road is not</mark>
62	placed in as good condition as it was prior to said <u>the</u>
63	permitted work being done, within 15 days from the time
64	said the permitted work is completed.
65	(d) Upon the receipt of an application for a permit
66	relating to electric transmission facilities, the department
67	shall determine whether the application is complete. If it is
68	not complete, the department, within 14 calendar days of
69	receiving the application, shall respond to the applicant in
70	writing with a description of any deficiency in the
71	application. Within 42 calendar days of receiving a completed
72	application for a permit for electric transmission facilities,
73	the department shall approve or deny the application. Unless
74	waived by the applicant, if the department fails to approve or
75	deny the application for a permit within the required 42-day
76	period, the requested permit shall be deemed issued by the
77	department upon the posting of the deposit or bond required by
78	subsection (c).
79	(e) The department, by rule, shall establish
80	requirements for the application and issuance of the permit.
81	(f) Any electric provider that intends to construct, or
82	is constructing, electric transmission facilities involving
83	state-controlled roads may request that department
84	representatives meet with its employees and representatives at

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85	least once every six months in order to update the department
86	on the electric provider's electric transmission development
87	plans, and the department representatives shall meet within a
88	reasonable period."
89	Section 2. In any condemnation action tangential to an
90	application for a permit under Section 23-1-4, Code of Alabama
91	1975, on motion from the plaintiff, the circuit court shall
92	enter an order assigning the case to the expedited track and
93	shall ensure resolution as expeditiously as feasible.
94	Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
95	1, 2025.
