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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, veterans who were exposed to
6	dangerous levels of radiation due to the atomic bomb
7	and weapon testing from 1944 to 1962 may be issued a
8	distinctive license tag for a motor vehicle.
9	This bill would expand the list of veterans
10	eligible to receive a distinctive license tag based on
11	exposure to dangerous levels of radiation.
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14	A BILL
15	TO BE ENTITLED
16	AN ACT
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18	Relating to license tags; to amend Section 32-6-350,
19	Code of Alabama 1975, to include additional veterans who were
20	exposed to dangerous levels of radiation due to their service
21	to those who may receive a distinctive license tag.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 32-6-350, Code of Alabama 1975, is
24	amended to read as follows:
25	"\$32-6-350
26	(a) It is the intent of the Legislature to establish an
27	Alabama Veteran Tag Program to recognize certain veterans.
28	(b) $(1)$ The owner of a motor vehicle who is a resident

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29 of this state and who is an eligible veteran pursuant to 30 subsection (c) may be issued a distinctive license tag 31 pursuant to this division. The veteran shall: (i) make 32 application to the judge of probate or commissioner of 33 licenses<sub> $\tau$ </sub>; (ii) comply with state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles<sub> $\tau$ </sub>; (iii) pay 34 35 the regular license fee for a tag as provided by law for a 36 private passenger or pleasure motor vehicle<sub> $\tau$ </sub>; and (iv) pay an additional fee of three dollars (\$3) for the initial issuance 37 of the tag except a Vietnam veteran's tag. 38

39 (2) In the case of a Vietnam veteran's tag, the additional fee for the initial issuance of the tag shall be 40 six dollars (\$6), three dollars (\$3) of which shall be 41 42 distributed to the Vietnam Veterans of America, Inc., Alabama 43 State Council, to be used to assist Vietnam veterans. For each renewal year, an additional fee of three dollars (\$3) shall be 44 45 paid for the Vietnam veterans tag. The additional fee of three 46 dollars (\$3) shall be distributed to the Vietnam Veterans of 47 America, Inc., Alabama State Council, to be used to assist 48 Vietnam veterans.

49 (c) The distinctive license tags in the Alabama Veteran
50 Tag Program shall include all of the following:

51 <u>(1) veterans Veterans</u> of the United States Armed 52 Forces exposed to dangerous levels of radiation due to the 53 atomic bomb and weapon testing from 1944 to 1962, who:

54 <u>a. Directly participated in the detonation of an atomic</u>
55 <u>weapon or device;</u>

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b. Directly participated in the cleanup of radioactive

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57	material resulting from any atmospheric detonation of or
58	accident associated with an atomic weapon; or
59	c. Were exposed to ionizing radiation resulting from
60	the operational use of atomic weapons during World War II.
61	(2) Vietnam veterans <sub>7</sub> .
62	<u>(3)</u> Korean War veterans <mark>7.</mark>
63	(4) World War II veterans <sub>7</sub> .
64	(5) veterans Veterans of the Battle of the Bulge $\tau$ .
65	(6) veterans Veterans of Desert Shield/Desert Storm $_{ au}$ .
66	(7) veterans Veterans of Operation Iraqi Freedom $_{\tau}$ .
67	<u>(8) veterans</u> Veterans of Operation Enduring
68	Freedom-Afghanistan <del>.</del>
69	(9) veterans Veterans of the Cold War serving at any
70	time between September 2, 1945, and December 26, 1991 <del>, and</del> .
71	(10) veterans Veterans of Operation Inherent Resolve.
72	(d) The distinctive tags shall be issued, printed, and
73	processed in the same manner as other distinctive tags as
74	provided in this chapter. The payment of the required motor
75	vehicle license fees and taxes when required by this section
76	for a year during which a new vehicle license plate is not
77	issued shall be evidenced as provided in Section 32-6-63.
78	(d) (e) The Vietnam Veterans of America, <u>Inc.</u> , Alabama
79	State Council $_{\underline{\prime}}$ for the Vietnam veterans distinctive tag, and
80	the Department of <u>Veterans'</u> <u>Veterans</u> Affairs for the other
81	distinctive veteran tags shall each respectively design or
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have designed the distinctive veteran tags, subject to approval by the Commissioner of Revenue and compliance with all laws and rules. An applicant for a Vietnam veteran tag

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85 shall be a Vietnam era veteran, and the local veteran's 86 affairs officer in the county in which application is made for the distinctive tag shall certify all Vietnam veterans 87 88 eligible for a Vietnam veteran distinctive tag. An applicant 89 for other veteran distinctive tags shall be a veteran of the 90 appropriate conflict or otherwise qualify for a veteran tag as 91 authorized by this section, and shall be certified as eligible 92 by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

93 (e) (f) The distinctive license tags shall not be 94 transferable between motor vehicle owners and shall be subject 95 to the same provisions of law related to the transferring of 96 distinctive motor vehicle tags provided in Section 32-6-154 or 97 as otherwise provided by law or rule of the Department of 98 Revenue."

99 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 100 1, 2025.
